<sup>4</sup> Esther 9 has the account of a 2 and 3 days celebration of the memorial of Purim.

<sup>5</sup> The leap month (also called Adar I) is added every few years in the Hebrew calendar to keep the biblical feasts aligned with their proper spring season. The biblical calendar is lunar (based on the moon) and not solar (sun).
